The African Studies Program at New College seeks a sessional lecturer from September 1, 2022 – December 31, 2022 to teach the following course:

AFR389H1F - THE GEOPOLITICS AND DEBATES ON AFRICA-CHINA ECONOMIC RELATIONS

AFR389H1F – Explores the geopolitics of Africa-Asia relations, in particular, the unabated and polarized debates and narratives on China's engagement across sectors in Africa, 'Africa-China' multifaceted trade relations, strategies and interests, and economic diplomacy. Critically examines the changing landscape of economic cooperation and development financing in contemporary Africa, their underlying impulses and their broader implications.

Minimum Qualifications

Completed or nearly completed Ph.D. in Anthropology, Political Science, African Studies, Law, Development Studies, or Geography and Planning and related disciplines. A scholarly background in African Studies and areas related to the specific course required. Teaching experience required.

Preferred Qualifications

Relevant teaching experience at the university level preferred.

Responsibilities

Normal duties related to the design and teaching of a university credit course, including preparation and delivery of course content; development, administration and marking of assignments, tests and exams; calculation and submission of grades; and holding regular office hours.
