



Butterfly (Asian and Migrant Sex Workers Support Network)

Butterfly is a grassroots and community-led organization supporting and advocating for the rights of Asian and migrant sex workers. It is founded upon the belief that sex workers are entitled to respect and basic human rights. Butterfly advocates for justice for Asian and migrant sex workers and for their safety and dignity.

Qualifications for working with Butterfly:

- Strong belief in community organizing and social justice (in particular sex workers' and migrant rights).
- Support the full decriminalization of sex work and status for all.
- Experience and skill in writing, editing, publication, graphic design, social media, multi-media, and community organizing would be significant assets.
- Language skills (writing and speaking Mandarin or Cantonese) would be significant assets.
- Knowledge of and experience in massage work, sex work, and migration would be significant assets.
- Being responsible and reliable.

Responsibilities

Researching the harm perpetrated by the anti-trafficking movement, by criminalization, and by repressive bylaws.

Produce informational resources and training materials.

Organize community events and campaigns to fight for justice for Asian and migrant sex workers.

Support the organizing of Asian and migrant massage workers and sex workers.
