The International Foundation Program ([ifp.utoronto.ca](http://ifp.utoronto.ca)) seeks 1 instructor to develop and teach the following half course to conditionally admitted undergraduate international students in the Faculties of Arts and Science, Architecture, and Music, in the Summer IFP Program during the Summer term from June 20 to August 21, 2025.

### ***IFP082H1S Strategies for Cross-Discipline Success***

This course focuses on recognising and maximising the transferability of academic skills across multiple undergraduate courses. Main themes include universal study skills, critical intensive reading strategies, research processes and citation styles, library systems, source evaluation, undergraduate course types, and integration into the academic community. While course topics prepare students for success in IFP100H, skills taught in this course are necessary for success in a range of courses in the Faculty of Arts & Science.

### **Minimum Qualifications**

Minimum requirements are a post-graduate degree in a second language acquisition related area or a bachelor's degree with equivalent professional experience. Also required is TESL training (TESL Canada Standard 2 or equivalent) and experience teaching English for academic purposes in post-secondary contexts. Applicants must be legally eligible to work in Ontario, Canada.

### **Preferred Qualifications**

Experience teaching this course in previous years is preferred.

### **Responsibilities**

- Preparation and teaching of course content (e.g. creating syllabus, weekly lectures, etc.)
- Grading assignments, tests, and final exam
- Collaborating with IFP instructional team
- Providing office hours for academic counseling of students
- Liaising with program staff as required
