### **Advanced Academic Course: Sciences Across the Spectrum**

#### **Course description**

How do we begin to understand the world around us? How are we able to explain phenomena that at one time seemed magical? This survey course introduces fundamental concepts across scientific disciplines in a seminar-style participatory classroom, including key concepts from physics, chemistry, biology, and earth sciences. Students will engage in group discussions, examine case studies, and participate in experiments (where practical) to develop a broad understanding of scientific inquiry and problem-solving. Emphasizing cross-disciplinary connection and the scientific method, students will come away with awareness of hypothesis formulation, experimentation, data analysis, and drawing conclusions.

#### **Minimum Qualifications**

Applicants must have, or be in the process of completing, a graduate degree closely related to the course subject area and must have experience teaching undergraduate students or high school students.

#### **Preferred Qualifications**

Working with multilingual students and/or high school students. Training in teaching students who speak English as an additional language. Experience teaching the course content to youth students in the Pre-University Program is preferred.

#### **Responsibilities**

- Preparation and teaching of course (e.g. adapting and delivering pre-existing materials, facilitating and grading student work, etc.) aligned with the program curriculum framework
- Maintaining records of attendance and submitting a written evaluation for each student
- Liaising with program staff and the Assistant / Academic Director as required
