

New College Residence Communities

New College has a variety of different living environments available, including both single-gender and gender-inclusive communities, and three living learning communities based around specific areas of study or interest. Due to demand, we cannot always accommodate all of our residents' first choices for their desired community. However, we do try to meet either their first or second preference.

Gender-Inclusive and Single-Gender Communities

Our **Gender-Inclusive Communities** (which includes our 3 LLCs) are located in all three of our buildings. They bring together first-year and upper-year students from all programs and areas of interest. These communities have gender-inclusive washrooms with multiple individually lockable shower/bath cubicles and toilet stalls.

Our **Single-Gendered Communities** also bring together first-year and upper-year students from all programs and areas of interest, but in an exclusively single-gender environment.

Locations: Men-identifying – 45 Willcocks, 5th Floor;

Women-identifying – Wilson Hall, 4th Floor and Wetmore Hall, 4th Floor

New College Living Learning Communities (LLCs)

Our **Life (+) Science Learning Community** brings together students in a Life Sciences program, or who have an interest in life sciences, health, or becoming a healthcare professional. This residential community strives for balance where residents are not only able to engage with college life but also gain academic and social support tailored for students studying or interested in Life Sciences. This community is supported by a specially selected Residence Don with an academic background in either Life Science or Healthcare studies and features programming tailored to the needs of Life Science students. **Location: Wilson Hall, 3rd floor.**

The **Innovation & Technology (iTECH) Learning Community** brings together those first-year and upper-year students committed to innovation and technology in their academic programs. This LLC is designed to attract those students who simply have a passion for technological innovation. This community is supported by a specially selected residence don with such a background, and who understand the pressures associated with a degree in the STEM fields. **Location: 45 Willcocks, 6th floor.**

Sustainability, Access, and Equity (SAE) Learning Community members will have the opportunity to be a part of a truly unique community and engage in thought provoking programming opportunities. This community is designed for students who are interested in issues of equity as it relates to social identities such as race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, religion, socioeconomic class, national origin, education, citizenship, (dis)ability, etc. and who wish to develop their understanding of these issues within a broader perspective of justice, sustainability, and community development. Programming in this community promotes participation in the New College Community and the wider University and Toronto communities and practical experiences in a variety of settings. **Location: 45 Willcocks, 2nd floor.**

New College Room Types

New College offers three different room options for residents: single rooms, double rooms, and economy double rooms.

We will make every effort to consider your room-type preferences. However, we are not always able to accommodate students' first choice requests. At New College, the majority of first-year residents live in a double or economy double room.

Single Room	Single rooms house an individual student in a room with their own single bed, desk, desk chair, and closet or wardrobe.
Double Room	Traditional university double rooms, housing two students in a spacious room. Each student in the room has their own desk, desk chair, single bed, and closet or wardrobe.
Economy Double Room	These double rooms maximize space by placing a bed over a desk. The bed-over-desk is set up like a bunk bed, except the lower bunk is removed and a desk is placed in this space, creating a cozy study space. Each student in the room is provided with their own bed, desk, desk chair, and closet or wardrobe. Economy double rooms typically have one bed-over-desk and one standard bed. <i>These rooms are only available in Wilson Hall.</i>
